Who observed Adapsilia coarctata Waga 1842 (Pyrgotidae)?

The above note from our colleague Valery A. Korneyev reports the first record in Belgium of *Adapsilia coarctata*, a very rare fly supposed to be almost extinct in Europe. It is a peculiar fly, of nearly 1 cm length and with coloured wings and reminds in a way of a Tephritid fruit fly.
