ORIENTAL CARABIDAE [COLEOPTERA]

I recently published a short paper on the Carabidae captured by Prince Leopold of Belgium in the course of his Expedition to the Dutch East Indies : this appeared last year among the « Résultats Scientifiques », vol. IV, fasc. 4. Four additional species were found in the adjoining regions, one of which appears to be novelty, but for the reason given below I do not feel able to describe it here.

1. *Diplocheila exotica* ANDR. Zool. Med. XIV. 1931, p. 66.

Borneo : River Barito, 1 ex. ♀. The only other examples known at present are the two Sumatran specimens which I described two years ago.

2. *Harpalini*, 4 ex. ♀ ♀.


Bali W. : Tjandi Koesoema. There is a strong likeness here to the genus *Harpalus*, but in this group the form and vesture of the ♂ protarsi are so important that it is undesirable to describe the species until examples of this sex are available for examination.

3. *Colpodes circumdatus* ANDR. Zool. Med. XIII, 1930, p. 196 ; id., Key to the Sumatran species of *Colpodes*, Zool. Med. XIV, 1931, p. 56.

Malacca : Fraser's Hill, 2 ex. Previously known both from the Malay States and from Sumatra.

4. *Pheropsophus fumigatus* DEJ. Spec. Gen. I. 1825, p. 307; CHAUD., Monographie des Brachynides, Ann. Soc. Ent. Belg., 1876, p. 40.

Philippine Is. : Mauo - Samar, 1 ex. I have no specimen for comparison, but the example agrees fairly well with the descriptions given by the two authors quoted above.
